
The COVID-19 pandemic has altered all of our daily routines, and the work of the Archives has been no exception. Since mid-March Nicole Crabbe and I have been working remotely, learning how to Zoom videoconference, answering e-mails and reference questions using digital resources on office servers, and making occasional trips to our vault. We hope to open to the public after "Phase Three" re-opening is approved by state public health officials. When we do, we will admit guests and volunteers by appointment only to maintain social distancing. Patrons will be required to wear face coverings, have their forehead temperatures taken before entrance to the building, and answer a familiar set of reminder questions to ensure limited exposure to the virus. Materials requested from our vault and library will be quarantined between users for several days which will impact research stays. Our Facebook page and Web site will announce our reopening schedule. Please e-mail our office at <u>moravianarchives@mcsp.org</u> to inquire about specific research needs.

To address the strain that the closing has for our budget, we are having to make expense reductions. This newsletter will now be delivered by e-mail rather than be printed and mailed.

In this issue we celebrate the banner support we received in 2019, with 150 gifts totaling \$34,251.58 to our Dr. C. Daniel Crews Friends Fund for unrestricted use. Included in that was an anchor gift of \$10,000 from the Starbuck Advisory Committee. We also had 25 donors to our Special Projects Fund for Technology, totaling \$12,150, including a \$5000 matching gift from Sallie Greenfield. We are grateful for the continued support of our friends in these uncertain times.



New Digital Offerings: Monthly E-News, Photo Contest, How-To Videos, MSC Zoom Meetings, Virtual Office Hours. Pandemic restrictions motivated several new digital Archives services. In April we converted our monthly e-news notice to an interactive publication (*left*), and we launched a public photo contest "Moravians Documenting the Pandemic" (*entry by Friedland Moravian member Kim Reed below left*). In May we offered YouTube "how-to" videos on the use of our Web site (*center*) and conducted our first Moravian Studies Collaborative meeting via Zoom videoconference with scholars up and down the East Coast (*right*). Zoom technology also allows staff to hold virtual office hours for the public Monday- Thursday from 11am until noon.


